Photos that are needed are conformation shots (show entire body including legs and feet) taken with no tack other than halter & lead:

Full view from both sides, front and back.

Riding videos should show all of the following:

Horse being mounted and ridden off

Being ridden at walk, trot & canter, and then transition back to walk or walk/gaits/walk if a gaited horse Stop, back, stand, dismount

Additional photos of horse in motion, head shots, or being ridden....and video showing other special talents or training of the horse are welcomed for promotional purposes. Submit to TheSafeHorseProject@gmail.com
